

WRIGHTSTOWN TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS
REGULAR MEETING May 18, 2026

The Wrightstown Township Board of Supervisors met on Monday, May 18, 2026, in the Meeting Room of the Wrightstown Township Municipal Building, 2203 Second Street Pike, Wrightstown, PA. Chair Chester S. Pogonowski called the meeting to order at 7:30 P.M. Present were Vice Chair Jane B. Magne, Treasurer Robert S. Lloyd, Solicitor Vicki Kushto, and Engineer Brian Cicak. All motions were approved by unanimous vote unless otherwise indicated.

ANNOUNCEMENTS:

Vice Chair Magne reminded residents that Primary Election Day is Tuesday, May 19. Polls will be open from 7:00 A.M. to 8:00 P.M.

PRESENTATION OF PENNSYLVANIA STATE ASSOCIATION OF TOWNSHIP SUPERVISORS (PSATS) YOUTH AWARD:

Chair Pogonowski recognized two visitors, Avi Abrol and Dillon Lind, to speak about their STEMStrong Project.

Dillon opened by saying that he and Avi came up with the project a year ago. They have been friends since elementary school. Because of their interest in science, they have been participating in science fairs together and have been fortunate to win a number of awards. They also volunteer together in STEM camps. While STEM can be challenging, it is also meant to be fun and engaging.

Avi went onto say that STEMStrong was meant to provide a fun and engaging atmosphere to STEM. They do this with demonstrations and hands on projects and experiments with students. While doing the projects, they teach the students the science behind it. Avi said that from a very young age he and Dillon have had the opportunities and resources in STEM. They found that not all kids had the same opportunities. There is a hope to create additional opportunities for kids to participate in events and increase their creativity with STEM.

Mr. David Sanko, the Executive Director for PSATS was introduced to make the presentation. He thanked the Board for sponsoring the award nomination. This project was recognized during the general session of the PSATS educational conference in April. Mr. Sanko presented the award and a \$500 check on behalf of PSATS.

Resolution 2026-12, STEMSTRONG Youth Award from PSATS. On motion by Vice Chair Magne and second by member Lloyd, a resolution was adopted recognizing Avi Abrol and Dillon Lind for receiving the PSATS Youth Award. The Resolution was passed commending STEMStrong for its outstanding achievement in receiving the Award and congratulating both young men for their outstanding leadership and dedication.

The Board then presented Avi and Dillon each with a certificate of recognition for their work and a signed copy of a Resolution 2026-12.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Chair Pogonowski deferred comment to the end of the meeting.

BUSINESS:

- A. Resolution 2026-13, PA Municipalities Bill of Rights (PSATS).** Chair Pogonowski opened by saying that he and Vice Chair Magne had attended the PSATS Education Conference and had the opportunity to sign onto an “electronic” Bill of Rights. In order to memorialize this action, Chair Pogonowski read the resolution declaring support for the PA Local Government Bill of Rights proposed by PSATS asking that municipalities be treated by the State as partners rather than subsidiaries. On a motion by Chair Pogonowski, seconded by Vice Chair Magne, the resolution was adopted. Mr. Sanko was provided with a signed copy.
- B. Resolution 2026-14 and 2026-15, Appointment of Planning Commission Members.** Vice Chair Magne related the background of George Mark. She proposed his appointment to the Planning Commission with his term expiring on December 31, 2028. On a motion by Vice Chair Magne, seconded by Treasurer Lloyd, Resolution 2026-14 was approved appointing George Mark to the Planning Commission. Vice Chair Magne summarized the resume of Chris Long. She proposed his appointment to the Planning Commission with his term expiring on December 31, 2030. On a motion by Vice Chair Magne, seconded by Treasurer Lloyd, Mr. Long was appointed as a member of the Planning Commission.
- C. Approval of Purchase of New Speed Sign (Township Line Road).** Foreman Dave James explained that there is a need for a new speed sign due to the previous sign being damaged by a passing truck. He presented quotes for a new sign on Township Line Road. On a motion by Vice Chair Magne, seconded by Treasurer Lloyd, purchase of a speed sign from All Traffic Solutions, LLC for \$3,789.93 was approved. It was noted that the equipment is manufactured in the USA and carries a three year warrantee.
- D. Review of the Private Family Burial Ordinance.** Solicitor Kushto gave a summary of changes to the proposed ordinance. After minor changes the ordinance will be brought back to the Board.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Joe Young from Dunkin at 811 Durham Road asked for guidance on the landscape plan for his business. He stated that the Township landscape ordinance is being considered for change and he would like to avail himself to those changes, as well as to amend his landscaping plan to help insure the future health of the plantings. The Board will meet with the professionals to decide on a course of action.
